The Council for British Research in the Levant (CBRL) is the British Academy sponsored society for research into the humanities and social sciences in the Levant based in London with research centres in the region. The CBRL promotes research in the modern countries of Cyprus, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, the Palestinian Territories and Syria, closely related to the former Bilad el-Sham.

Membership of the CBRL includes a subscription to *Levant* and the annual *Bulletin* in both print and online formats. Membership entitles holders to use CBRL research facilities in its regional centres; this includes access to libraries, computers, research space, hostels, vehicle hire and assistance by CBRL staff. Members also receive invitations to all CBRL lectures and events.

Grants

The CBRL usually has funds each year to support research in the humanities and social science subjects relating to the countries of the Levant. Priority is given to research that falls within CBRL's research strategy.

Research Awards: To support postdoctoral research projects from initial exploratory work through to publication, for work in the countries of the Levant. Number varies, offered annually; value up to £10,000, closing date 1 December. Applicants should normally be either a British citizen or ordinarily a resident in the UK.

Travel Grants: To cover costs of travel and subsistence of students and academics and researchers undertaking reconnaissance tours or smaller research projects in the countries of the Levant. Number varies, offered annually, value up to £800, closing date 15 January. Applicants should normally be either a British Citizen or ordinarily resident in the UK or registered on a full-time degree at a UK University.

Visiting Research Fellowships: To enable doctoral students and established scholars to spend a period of between three and nine months in the Levant, to include a minimum period of one month based at the British Institute in Amman or the Kenyon Institute in Jerusalem, in order to undertake research on the countries of the Levant. Number varies, offered annually, closing date 15 January. Applicants should normally be either a British Citizen or ordinarily resident in the UK or registered on a full-time doctoral degree in a UK university.

Individual Membership to the CBRL is £35 in 2009 (£33 if paid by direct debit and £15 for students and unwaged members)
